my Water Grist Mill during her Natural Life she being at
half the Charge of keeping the said Mill in repair I do likewise
give my said Wife part of the Plantation whereon I now live

to the Mill Road during her Natural Life, and likewise the
labour of my two Negroes Cuomba and June during her Natural
Life. I do likewise give my said Wife all the residue of my
