In the Name of God. Amen I Robert West of the Isles of Wight County, being sick and weak of Body but of perfect Mind and Memory do constitute and Ordain, this my last Will and Testament. First I recommend my Soul to God, and my Body to the Earth to be buried in such decent manner, as my Executors shall think fit and as to my worldly Goods, I dispose of them in the following manner

Item I Give and Bequeath to my son Richard West my Water Lynd Mill Likewise give my said son, Richard West and to his heirs forever a Parcel of Land lying on the East side of the Mill Road joining on the East of Merchant Berry. Likewise give my said son Richard West

06 With the Service of my Negroes my married Daughter and one Chest and half my Sister

Item I give unto my Son Ralph West my Negro Woman named June likewise give unto my said Son Ralph West my Negro Girl named Jane, and the other half of my Sister

Item I do give one feather Bed and the Furniture belonging to it for the Use of my two Sons, and my Desire is that my two Sons may have four years schooling to each of them, to be paid for out of the Profits of my Estate, and if my Executor thinks fit to sell my Negro Woman June, and the money to be kept for my Son Ralph West

Item I give unto my Sister Ann West twenty Shillings yearly till the Day of Marriage

Item I do give the Remainder of my Estate and Profits of the Legacies to bring up my Children and to pay my Debts, and I do nominate and appoint Giles West my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament

But if my two Sons shall both die without Heirs then it is my Will and Desire that my Brother Giles West should have my Will and all the Rest of my Estate except my two Negro Women, June and Jane, and them I give to my Sister Ann West, and for my Brother Giles West, to make my Sister Ann West, a good Right to Jane, and if my Sons should both die without Heirs then I give to my Brother James West five Shillings

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand, and fixed my Seal, this Nineteenth Day of September One Thousand seven Hundred and fifty one
