Memory. do make and Ordain this my last Will & Testament  
in manner and Form following.

Item I leave the Use of my Plantation at Meherin to my loving Mother  
Amy Jones during her natural Life. and after her Decease  
I leave the Use to my Sister Mary White during her Natural life  
and after her Decease I give & Bequeath the said Plantation to  
my Cousin Ann White. and to her forever. and in Case she should  
die without Heirs. to her Sister Mary White.

Item I give and Bequeath the Negro Coffey to my loving Sister Sarah  
Davis. to her and her Heirs forever

Item I give and Bequeath to my loving Mother Amy Jones my  
Negro Fellow Tim to her forever

Item I give and Bequeath to my loving Sister Amy Davis fifty Pounds  
Curr. Money of Virginia to her and her Heirs forever

Item I give and Bequeath to my loving Sister Marsillik Davis  
Fifty Pounds Curr. Money of Virginia to her & her Heirs forever

Item I give to my loving Sister Mary White five Pounds Curr money  
to buy her a Horse. and tis my Desire that my Executor should  
see to the laying of it out for the said Use

Item After my Funeral Expences I give the Remainder of my Estate  
to be divided between my loving Sisters Sarah. Amy. & Marsillik  
And if in case my Sister Sarah Davis negro fellow Coffey. as I  
give her should die before she is in Possession of him. then I  
give her the said Remainder to her forever

And I do appoint my loving Father in Law. my whole and  
Sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament. and acknowledge  
this to be my last Will. and Testament this 28<sup>th</sup> of November  
1750.
