Jesus Christ my Mediator and Redeemer in Hopes that  
I shall receive free Pardon and Forgiveness of all my Sins, and my  
Body I commit to the Earth from whence it was taken and  
there to be Buried at the Discretion of my Exec<sup>r</sup> hereafter mentioned  
I *Item*. I give to my Grand Daughter Mary Page one Shilling.  
And all the rest of my Estate after my lawfull Debts & Funerall  
Charges Paid; I give to my Wife Ann Page during her Natural  
Life and after her Decease, I give it to Betty Fort to her & her  
Heirs Lawfully begotten of her own Body, and if she Dies without  
Heirs then to Joshua Fort, and to his Heirs forever. I do hereby  
make John Fort and Rebeckah Fort my whole Exec<sup>r</sup> of this my  
last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 16<sup>th</sup> Day of October 1746.

In the Name of God. Amen. Novemb<sup>r</sup>  
the Fifth day 1743. I Simon Everitt of the Isles of Wight County  
being in my Body very well in Health and in my perfect Sense  
& Memory, praised be Almighty God for the same, And knowing  
the uncertainty of this Life and that all Men are Mortall am  
minded

Minded to make and Exec<sup>t</sup> this my last Will and Testament you followeth. And First and principally I Bequeath my soul to Almighty God that gave it to me, and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be Buried after a Decent and Christian like manner as my Exec<sup>r</sup> shall think fitt, and as for the Rest of my worldly Goods which it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow on me in this Life I have dispose of them in manner and Form as followeth (Viz) —

**Imprimis.** I give unto my Son Joseph Everitt the Land and plantation that I bought of William Cairn to him & his Heirs for ever. And I give him the Gun that he now hath in Possession, I give to him, and my Pistolls and Holster's and sword. I give the same to him forever. And I give to my Son Joseph one Feather Bed and Furniture thereto belonging. and I give to him five Cows and Calves and two Heifers. And I give him three pewter Dishes and six Plates, and one Iron pot. And I give him one Negro Boy named Luke. And I give to my Son Joseph five pounds Currency of Virginia; And I give to my Son Joseph the half of my new Survey and his Part Beginning at John Mackmills Corner Tree thence along a line of marked Trees to a Branch then down the said Branch to the Creek called Tarraro Creek; And the half of my Still I give to my Son Joseph Everitt, All this give to him forever —

**Item.** I give to my Son Simon Everitt the manour plantation that I now live on, and the Land thereto belonging. And also the Remainder part of my new Survey that I have given my Son Joseph the one half, and my Son Amos the other half as it is Bounded before. I give to him and his Heirs forever. And I give to him my Mill and my Negro Wench called Violet and a Negro Boy called Mingo, and one feather and Furniture and three Dishes, and half a Dozen Plates, and one Bason; and three Cows and Calves, and one Iron pot, and the other half of the Still and I give him two Guns, one large one and the other a small one and one Chest. I give it to him and his Heirs forever.

**Item.** I give to my Grand Son, Amos Williams two Cows & Calves and one Heifer & two pewter Dishes —

**Item.** I give to Catharine Dye one Cow & Calf and one Heifer. —

And as for the Remainder part my Estate when my Debts and Legacies is paid off, my Will is that it should be Equally Divided amongst my two Daughters Patience Turner & Sarah Turner, and Joseph Everitt and Simon Everitt —

Item. I give my Daughter Patience Turner one Negro Boy named Peter to her and her Heirs for ever —

Item. I give to my Daughter Sarah Turner one Negro Boy named Isaac to her and her Heirs for ever —

And I do appoint my son Joseph Everitt and my son Simon Everitt to be my who Exec<sup>r</sup> of this my last Will and Testament And I do allow this to be my last Will and Testam<sup>t</sup>. disallowing all others that been made before by me. As Witnesses my hand and Seal the day and Year first above Written. —
