In a Court held for Isle of Wight County August the 3rd 1740

The last Will and Testament of Thomas Scott deceased was presented to
Court by Joan Scott, one of the Executors therein named who made affidavit
thereto, and being proved, by the affirmation of William Hollowell and the
Oath of James Baker the Witness thereto is Ordered to be Recorded
Sept. 1st 1740 J. Baker seal.

In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Barlow being
very sick and weak in Body but of perfect sound Sense and Memory
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and Form
following &c.

Item I give and Bequeath to my Nephew William Carrall my River side
Plantation called Piney Point which includes all the Land from the
Spring Swamp up to Fiveashes Lane to him during his natural life
to have peaceable and quiet Possession to occupy and Enjoy the
same as his own, My Meaning is that if the said William Carrall
should be a widow or turned out of Possession of the Tenement or
Plantation above mentioned by any Person or Persons That in such

thereof I do Give and Bequeath to the S^r. William Carroll my Friend
Current Money of Virginia to him and his friends
I lend the Labour of my two Negroes Samy. and Nancy to my loving Wife
Martha Barlow during her widowhood

Item. I Give and Bequeath unto my loving Wife Martha Barlow my
best Leather Bed and Furniture and my Larger leather Trunk and
my Iron Table also my sorrell Horse and Siamese during
her Widowhood

Item. I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Barlow my Negroe Ann
Henry to her and her Heirs forever

Item. I Give and Bequeath to my Son Jeppe Barlow two nego Boys Bob
and Silver to him and his Heirs forever also my Mill

Item. I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Barlow my two nego
Charles Colia and Rose to her and her Heirs forever

Item. I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Jeppe Barlow my Negroe Wench
Henry to his Heirs forever

Item. I Give and Bequeath unto my Nephew William Carroll my —
mother's —
second best Bed and Furniture and six Cows, six Ewes and six —
Hire of Hogg's and all my Boates to him & his Heirs forever —

Item. I Give and Bequeath all the Rest and Residue of my Estate, left & be
for that sort sever to be equally divided between my Wife and three
Children and my Meaning is that my Wife's Part at the Day of —
Marriage shall return to my three Children, to be equally —
divided between them. Also I do appoint my loving Wife my —
Executor and my Nephew William Carroll my Executor of this
my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal, this 3^d Day of December 1748.
