very sick and weak in Body but of perfect sound Sense and Memory
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and Form
following, &c

Item I give and Bequeath to my Nephew William Carrell my River side
Plantation, called Piney Point, which includes all the Land from the
Spring Swamp up to Fincashes Lane, to him during his naturall
Life to have peaceable and quiet Possession to occupy and Enjoy the
same as his own, My Meaning is that if the said William Carrell
should be disturbed or hurried out of Possession of the Tenement or
Plantation above mentioned by any Person or Persons That in Live
hand

thereof I do Give and Bequeath to thers. William Carrell my Son
Current Money of Virginia to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give the Labour of my two Negroes Samy and Hans to my loving Wife
Martha Barlow during her widowhood

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my loving Wife Martha Barlow my
best Feather Bed and Furniture and my large Seaboard Trunk and
my Oval Table also my sorrell Horses and Saddle during
her Widowhood

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Barlow my Negro Man
Harry to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Jesse Barlow two negro Boys Bob
and Merv to him and his Heirs forever also my Mill

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Barlow my two negro
Curtis Colia and Rose to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Jesse Barlow my Negro Wench
Tommy to ^{him} his Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Nephew William Carrell my
second best Bed and Furniture and six Cows six Ewes and six
Hire of Hogges and all my Doats to him & his Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath all the Rest and Residue of my Estate lett it be
of what sort soever to be equally divided between my Wife and three
Children and my Meaning is that my Wifes Part at the Day of
Marriage shall return to my three Children to be equally
divided between them also I do appoint my loving Wife my
Executrix and my Nephew William Carrell my Executor of this
my last Will and Testament In Witnes hereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal this 3^d Day of December 1748
