

I Thomas Day of the County of Lincoln being a man of sound Mind, Memory, and Understanding do make and appoint this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (to wit) —

First I give to my loving Wife Mary Day the use of her Negroe during her natural life / to say Tom. Bess. Moll. Tegg. Doll. and Sam. and after her Decease I give the said Negroe to my two Sons Thomas and John Day to be equally divided between them. Likewise give to my said Wife Mary One Bed and Furniture, One Walnut Oval Table three feet, and half in the Bed, One Tea Table, One Stand, and half Dozen of plain Chairs

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son Thomas Day four Negroe to say York, Molkin, Lucy and Coffe, likewise my Stile, Cap. and Worm, One chest of Drawers two Oval Tables, three feet in the Bed, one with Coffe feet, the other a turned Frame, and half a Dozen large Chairs with Walnut Frames Upon this PROVISO that he my Son Thomas Day doth at his coming of age agree that all the Profits of his whole Estate, both real and personal, that shall be thought more than sufficient / by my Executors herein after mentioned / for his and the said Slaves Maintenance may from the Date hereof be applied to the maintaining and educating of his Brother John Day till he the said John shall arrive at the Age of Eighteen, and in case that he my Son Thomas should ever endeavour to bring his said Brother to an Account for the Money or Profits so expended, then it is my Will and Desire that the above Slaves, York, Molkin, Lucy and Coffe together with the Stile, Cap. and Worm, and all other legacys before given, may immediately be the Right and Property of my son John Day hereby barring my said Son Thomas Day from any Right or Claim from this my Will to any of the above legacys. Also give to my Son Thomas Day my silver hilted sword, my Pistols — Houlsters, and Housing also my riding Saddle. And further it is my Will and Desire that if my Son Thomas should die without lawfull Issue, that my son John Day should have and be immediately possessed of the said Slaves and other legacys above mentioned.

Item I give and Bequeath to my Son John Day five Negroe / to say Jacob, Nancy, Belinda, Charles, and Harry also one Scrubbing One large Oval Table

364. I have put on my Bed a white Sheet, and a covering Sheet, half Draper  
long and wide enough to cover my Bed, and my Son Thomas Day's Bed, and a white Lawfull  
Sheet, it is my Desire that my Son Thomas Day may have the Room.  
Item. Jacob Marry, Bellinda, Charles and Harry and all the other Legacy's ~  
above mentioned and further I give to my Son John Day Twenty five  
Pounds in Money to be paid out of my Estate to be applied towards  
saving and Building on a Lot or Lots in the Town of Smithfield  
if my Executors shall think it necessary, or advantagious to him  
Item. It is my will and Desire that my Executors herein after mentioned  
may have the sole Right and Property of bringing up my two Sons ~  
Thomas and John Day, in such Manner and to such lawfull  
Business or Employments as they shall think most to their Benefit  
and Advantage, and their Estates will allow ~

Lastly. It is my will and Desire that all the Remainder of my Estate of  
what Nature or kind soever, after my Funeral Expenses and Debts are  
paid, may be equally divided between my loving Wife and my two Sons  
Thomas and John Day, leaving my Wife Mary Day Executrix and Mr  
William Hodson and Maj<sup>r</sup> Benjamin Cooke Executors of this my last  
Will and Testament wherunto I have set my Hand and Seal this  
Twenty fourth Day of July 1750.
