In the Name of God. Amen. I Thomas Gay of
the Telsight County, being very sick and weak of Body
but sound and perfect in Memory and senses blessed be
God, for the same, I therefore do think fit to make this my
last Will and Testament. In Manner and form following
First and principally I commit my Soul into the Hands
of Almighty God, of whom I hope to receive Pardon of
all my Sins, and Secondly, my Body to the Earth, from
whence it was taken, to be buried in a Christian and
decently like Manner, and after my Debts are justly
satisfied all my Estate, that it hath pleased the
Almighty, to indow me with, to be disposed of as followeth

1st I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Thomas Gay, one
Hundred Acres of Land, be the same more or less within
the Bounds hereafter mentioned Beginning on the Swamp,
at the Mouth of a small Branch, next to my dwelling
House, and so up the Branch, to the Head, and thence a
straight Line, to Lillo's Line, and so along that Line to
John Williams his Line, and down his Line to the Swamp
and so down the Swamp to the Beginning, to him, and
his Heirs forever

2^d I Give and Bequeath unto my Son John Gay, my Manour
dwelling, with all the Remainder of my Lands, being one
Hundred Acres, be the same more or less, to him, and his Heirs
forever

3^d I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Thomas Gay, one small
Tract, to him, and his Heirs, forever

4th I Give, and Bequeath unto my two Sons Thomas, and John Gay
each of them one Cow and Calf, and one Sow & Piggs, a piece
to them and their Heirs forever

I Give and Bequeath unto my aforesaid Son Thomas
and John their heirs allowing them of Age to receive their
Legacies &c

I Do desire that the Monthly Meeting do order and
settle all the rest of my Children namely Charles Mary
William. Edmund. and Jonathan Gay amongst Friends
for their Education &c

I Give and Bequeath unto my five Children Charles
Mary William. Edmund. and Jonathan Gay the Effects
of all the rest of moveable Estate to be equally divided
amongst them in Manner following That is to say
I do order that my Executor hereafter mentioned shall
sell at publick Auction all that Part of my Estate
given to my five Children aforesd. allowing twelve
Months Credit for the same which Money is to be
divided as aforesaid to them and their Heirs forever
And Lastly I do ordain constitute and appoint my
Friend William Cley my whole and sole Executor of
this my last Will and Testament Revoking and
disannulling all other Wills heretofore by me made
In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and
Seal this 25th of October 1750.
