Isle of Wight County in Virginia being in perfect Health and
Memory. I Give unto almighty God my Soul who gave it
unto me, and my Body to the Earth, to be buried in a Christian
like Manner, and as for all my Worldly Goods, as it hath
pleased God to induce me with I do give in Manner and
Form as followeth —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Godfry Powell my Land
and Plantation, where I now live and all my Carpenters and
Carpenter Tools, and one Yoke of Oxen and one Cow and Calf, the
Yoke of Oxen, my Will and Desire is that my Wife Sarah should
have the Liberty of the Use of them, and one Pewter Dish and one
Pewter Plate, I Give it to him and his Heirs forever —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Coggin five
Shillings I Give it to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my beloved Wife Sarah Powell, two
Cows and Calves and one large Heifer, and all the Remaining
Part of my Estate to her during her Widowhood, and after my
Will and Desire is that my Son Godfry should have it be it in
what kind soever it will after my just Debts is paid and I do
appoint my Son Godfry Powell, my whole and sole Executor of
this my last Will and Testament to see it performed, and done
according to the true Intent hereof, whereof I have hitherto set my
Hand and Seal, this 28th day of February 1750 —

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann West. three Gold
Rings. I do likewise give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann West
one Chest of Drawers and all that stand on it. I likewise give and
Bequeath to my Daughter Ann West. Two silver Salts one Red and
one Black. One Silver Basin. Six white Chairs. one black Leather
Trunk. and Ten Silver Plates one brown Hair

Item I likewise give and Bequeath to my Son James West. one
Coach of Hears Cart and Wheels. Six Silver Plates. three Cows
and Calves one Black Chest.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Robert West. all the Remainder
of my Estate not before given away.

Item I Give to my Daughter Ann West. One Horse. four Silver Knives
Two Glasses. three Bowls one small Bottle
I do nominate and appoint my son Robert West. to be whole and
sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this
Nineteenth day of December One Thousand seven Hundred and
fifty
