and Form following that is to say. First I commend my soul
into the Hands of almighty God that gave it hoping through
the Merits Death and Passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to
have full and free Pardon and Forgiveness of all my Sins and
my Body I commit to the Earth to be decently buried at the
Discretion of my Executors hereafter named First I will that all
my Debts and funeral Charges be paid and discharged. and all
my Worldly Goods I Give and dispose of as followeth

Imprimis I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Martha Wiggell the
Bed and Furniture she lies on. two Cows and Calves. two Sows
and Piggs. two Ewes and Lambs and one Iron St. one Hard
Silver Plate and a Gold Ring to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give to my Son James Wiggell. my Young Horse and all my
hooping Furniture to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Wiggell my smaller Gun
and two Cows and Calves. two Ewes and Lambs and two Sows
and Piggs. and one Feather Bed. and Furniture to him and
his Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath to my loving Wife Sarah Wiggell. my
riding Horse and Saddle to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Newman one Cow and calf

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son James Wiggell the lower part
of my Plantation beginning on the Cypress Side. running to
the Mirey Branch. up the Branch to the Fork. from the Head of
the Fork of the said Branch. to the first Fork of the Reddy Branch
down the Branch to the Cypress. down the Cypress to the first
Station containing One Hundred eighty or thereabouts Acres whereto let
his Brother Thomas Wiggell have Timber off from it. for his
Plantations Use to him the said James Wiggell to him and
his Heirs forever

Item I Give unto my Son Thomas Wiggell the upper Part of my
Plantation. whereto I now live. containing One Hundred and
Eighty

Eighty six Acres. to him and his heirs forever
I Give to my loving Wife Sarah Wyzell my Negro Woman Moll
to her and her disposing and I Give her my Plantation I
bought of Henry Turner. that lies on the South Side of the
Cypress. to her and her heirs forever

I Give to my Daughter Mary Lowry one Heifer
I Give and Bequeath to my loving Wife Sarah Wyzell the Use
of the Part of my Estate during her Life and after her Death
to be equally divided amongst my Children

I Nominate and appoint my loving Wife Sarah Wyzell
my Son James Wyzell. and Thomas Wyzell. to be my whole
and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament
and I do hereby Revoke, Disannul. and make Void all former
Wills and Testaments heretofore by me made. In Witnes
whereof I have set my Hand and fixed my Seal this
fourteenth Day of April 1748.

Joiner and Bartholomew Lightfoot the Witnesses thereto and
Ordered to be Recorded

In Obedience to an Order of Stafford County Court bearing
Date April 4th 1751. We the Subscribers being sworn before Mr
John Mills one of his Majestys Justices for the afores^d County
we have appraised so much of the Estate of William Lane
deceased as was brought to our View by the Adm^r in the Manner
following.
