I give to my Brother John Willis now in Scotland Son of Pistler; all the rest Residue and Remainder of my Estate of what kind soever, I give to my Loving Wife Martha Willis during her Natural Life, and after her Decease, to my Brother John and the Heirs of his Body; and in default of such Heirs to George Willis (Son of Robert Willis Deceased in June Attorney at Law) and for the true Performance of this my last Will, I do appoint my Loving Friends John Woodrop James Asher and William Goodson my Executors or any one of them that my Loving Wife Martha shall Nominate. In Witness whereof I have ^{written} set my hand and Seal this 21st Day of December in the Year of our Lord 1750. and in Presence of
