Item I give to my Brother John Willis now in Scotland Esq. Pistolen; all the rest residue and Remainder of my Estate of what kind soever, I give to my Loving Wife Martha Willis during her Natural Life, and after her Decease, to my Brother John and the Heirs of his Body; and in default of such heirs to George Willis (Son of Robert Willis Deceased in Dune Attorney at Law) and for the true Performance of this my last Will, I do appoint my Loving Friends John Woodrope James Asher and William Goodson my Executors or any one of them that my Loving Wife Martha shall Nominate. In Witness whereof I have ^{thence} set my hand and Seal this first Day of December in the Year of our Lord 1750. and in Presence of
