Item I Give and Bequeath to my son Josiah Mills his Part -
Negro Woman Rager —

Item I Give and Bequeath to my son Josiah Mills Twenty Pounds Cash, when he shall attain to the age of twenty one years —

My Will and Desire is that my loving Wife Martha Mills have the Use of all my Negros, and personal Estate — during her Widdowhood. —

Item My Will and Desire is that all my Negros and other Estate, whatsoever be equally divided Between my three Sons That is to say Miles John, and Josiah, after their Mothers Death or Marriage —

And I do constitute and Appoint my loving Wife, whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will, and Testament, as —
Witness my Hand and Seal this 18th day of October, 1750 —
