 it is appointed for all Men once to Die: Do make & Ordain
 this my last Will and Testament. That is to say Principally
 and first of all. I give and recommend my Soul into the
 Hands of God that gave it: And for my Body. I recommend
 it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and decent
 manner at the Discretion of my Executors, Nothing doubting
 but at the general Resurrection, I shall receive the same again
 by the mighty power of God. And as Touching such Worldly
 Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this
 Life I give Devise and Dispose of the same in the following
 manner and Form. —

Imprimis. I give and Bequeath to Judith my dearly
 beloved Wife One feather Bed and Furniture thereto
 belonging One Iron Stoll and one flying Saddle, and one puster
 Dish and Basin, & one Dove tail Chest. —

Item. I give and Bequeath to my well beloved Son John Cocksey
 whom I likewise constitute, make and Ordain my only and
 sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, all and
 Singular my Lands Messuages and Tenements and all
 not herein otherwise given by him freely to be Possessed and
 Enjoyed after my, and my Wifes Death, by him his Heirs
 and Assigns forever. And I do hereby utterly disallow
 Revoke and disannull all and every other former Testam^{ts}
 Will, Legacies and Executors, by me in any ways before this
 Time. Named, Willed and Bequeathed, Ratifying & confirming
 this, and no other, to be my last Will and Testament. **In**
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal
 the Day and Year above Written.

In the Name of God. Amen. I Michael
Murphery of the County of Isles of Wight in Virginia being weak
in Body and perfect Sense and Memory doth make this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth.

Imprimis. I give my Soul to God my maker and Redeemer
and secondly my Body to the Earth from whence it came to be
Decently buried after a Christian like manner. And the rest of
my Estate which God hath given me I Dispose as followeth.

Item. I give to my Son John Murphery all my Land that
I am now Possesst with that lies on the West side of the Cedar
Branch, And also I give him my Horse Bridle & Saddle, and
my ball faced Ox for to pay my Debts with. And also two broad
plaster Dishes, and two leather Chairs, and a Cwe, and also my
Wearing Cloaths.

Item. I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Dixon a Cwe, and a
broad plaster Dish, and a broad Horn Heifer with a short Tail.

Item. I give to my Daughter Mary Murphery the Bed
that I now lie on, & Bolster and Bedstead and a Rug and a
Blanket and a Sheet that belongs to the same.

Item. Now the rest of my moveable Estate I give to my three
Daughters Mary Murphery and Sarah Murphery & Elender
Murphery to be equally Divided between them.

Item. I give to my Grand Son Michael Murphery my
Plantation that I now live on and all my Land that lies on
the East side of the Cedar Branch, to have it properly his
own after the Decease of his three Aunts or the Marriage of
them Mary and Sarah & Elender Murphery; and he shall
not
