In the Name of God Amere The Twenty fourth Day of December 1751 I William Daughtry Gent. of the County of Isles & Wight in the Province, being very sick & weak in body but in perfect mind and memory thanks be given to almighty God, Therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die do make & ordain this my last Will and Testament &c That I do give & principally and first I give and bequeath my Soul unto the Hands of God that gave it and my Body I commend to the Earth to be buried in Decent and Christian Burial

Bequeath at the Discretion of my Executors. Nothing Doubting
but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly Estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life
I give and Dispose of the same in the following manner
to wit —

Item I give and Bequeath unto my loving Son John Daughtry Senr.
after my decease and my wife's one Negro Boy call'd Kings during
his natural Life, and after his decease to his Son Moses Daughtry
and in case the said Moses should die without Issue Lawfully of
his Body then the said Negro Boy to Descend and be his Brother
Benjamin Daughtry and one feather Bed and furniture and
one large hood and a Looking glass and a Iron Pott one
Pewter dish and a Bason and two Plates and one Brass chellat
and frame and one Iron Pott Rack and one Iron spit and a
Round Table.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my loving Daughter Priscilla Daughtry
after my decease and my wife's one feather Bed and furniture
and one old Negro Man call'd Dick and one large Black Trunk
and one Pewter dish and a Bason and two Plates and one Iron Pott

Item I give and Bequeath unto my loving Daughter Mary Holland
after my decease and my wife's one feather Bed and furniture and
a Negro Girl call'd Cooker and ^{one} Pewter dish and a bason and two
Plates and one Iron Pott, and in case the said Negro Girl Cooker
should live Longer then my said Daughter Mary then the said
Negro to descend and be my grandson William Holland's

Item I give and Bequeath unto my loving Daughter Elizabeth Parker
after my decease and my wife's one Iron bound Case and eleven bottles
thereunto belonging and one small challokin Trunk and two Plates
and two hangers

Item I give and Bequeath unto my loving grandson John Daughtry Junr
after my decease and my wife's one great Chest one Cupboard of
one hard Wood one small Iron one pair of Millars and one
pair of Iron Wedges and one pair and all the Carpenters Tools
and all the Ship's Tools and all the shoe makers Tools and one
pair of Money Scales and one Iron Pott hanger being the eldest
of my Pott hangers and one Iron Pott and one of the Bed
Pewter

I have Tankards and one pint bottle and all my silver and
 both Sheep Hoggs Cattle and horses and fowls and one sack and a
 bason and two Plates. and it is my Will and desire that all the remainder
 of my Estate be Equally Divided amongst three of my Children and
 my grandson John Daughtry namely my son John Daughtry and
 my Daughter Priscilla Redgfeldt and my Daughter Mary Tallant
 and further I Likewise make and Ordain my loving grandson
 John Daughtry aforesaid my sole Executor of this my last Will &
 Testament and I do hereby utterly Disallow Revoke and disannull
 all and every other former Testaments Wills Legacies & Bequestes
 and Executors by me in any wise before now made and
 Bequestes Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be
 my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and date above written.
