Bound at the Discretion of my Executors. Nothing Doubting
 but at the Funeral R^emembration I shall receive the same gain
 by the mighty Power of God and as Trusting such Worldly Estate
 wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life
 I give and Bequeath and dispose of the same in the following manner
 & form to —

ITEMS. I give and Bequeath unto loving Son John Daughtry Sen.
 after my decease and my wife's one Negro boy called Mingo during
 his natural life, and after his decease to his son Moses Daughtry
 and in case the said Moses should die without Heir lawfully of
 his body then the said Negro boy to depend and be his Brother
 Benjamin Daughtry and one feather Bed and furniture, and
 one large hoop and a Looking glass and a Iron Pot, one
 Pewter dish and a Bacon and two Plates and one Brass kettle
 and for me and one Iron Pot Rack and one Iron spitt and a
 Round Table.

ITEM I give and Bequeath unto my loving Daughter Priscilla Hodges
 after my decease and my wife's one feather Bed and furniture
 and one old Negro Man called Dick and one large Black Trunk
 and one Pewter dish and a Bacon and two Plates and one Iron Pot

ITEM I give and Bequeath unto my Loving Daughter Mary Holland
 after my decease and my wife's one feather bed and furniture and
 a Negro girl called Cooker and Pewter dish and a bacon and two
 Plates and one Iron Pot, and in case the said Negro girl Cooker
 should live Longer than my said Daughter Mary then the said
 Negro to descend and be my Grandson William Hollands

ITEM I give and Bequeath unto my loving Daughter Elizabeth Parker
 after my decease and my wife's one Ironbound Cige and Eleven Bottles
 shrounts belonging and one small sealskin Trunk and two Plates
 and two Loringes,

ITEM I give and Bequeath unto my loving grand son John Daughtry Jun
 after my decease and my wife's One great Chest one Cupboard by
 one hand Mill one small gun one pair of Scissors and one
 pair of Iron Wedges and one pair and all the carpenters Tools
 and all the Joiners Tools and all the show makers Tools and one
 pair of Money Scales and one Iron Pot hanger being the Dash
 of my first Hangars and one Iron Pot and one of the Best of
 Pewter

Pawt Tanhard and one Pond Ls and all my other Goods
 both Sheep Hogs Cattle and horses and flocks and much and a
 Basin and two Plates, and it is my Will and desire that the remainder
 of my Estate be Equally Divided amongst three of my Children and
 my Grandson John Daughtry namely my son John Daughtry and
 my Daughter Priscilla Hudspeth and my Daughter Mary Hallard
 and further I Likewise make and Ordain my daughter
 John Daughtry aforesaid my sole Executrix of this my last Will &
 Testament and I do hereby utterly Difflow Backward and disannull
 all and every other former Testaments Wills Signes of Procuracion
 and Executors by me in any wise before named wills and
 Bequeath'd Ratifying and Confirming this and nother to be
 my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and date above written
 Signed Sealed and Declared and Pronounced —
 and Delivered as his last Will & Testament. *William W. Daughtry*
