In the Name of God. Amen. I William Miller, being very Low and weak in Body but of perfect Sense of Mind and Memory, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament. First and Principally, I do recommend my Soul to Almighty God, my Body to the Earth to be Decently Buried. And as for such worldly Goods as it pleased God to Endow me with, I do give & Bequeath in manner & form following.

Imprimis. I do give and Bequeath unto my James Miller my Negro Caesar and Beck and Judy and their future Increase to him and his Heirs for Ever, and Forty Pounds Cash to be paid at the Age of Twenty one Years; And that he may be Educated & maintained by the profits arising by the above Slaves and

Item. I do give and Bequeath unto my Son William my Negro Sam and Patience and Sarah and her future Increase to him & his Heirs for ever, and Sixty Pounds Cash, to be paid at the Age of Twenty One Years, and that he may be Educated & maintained by

by the profits arising by the said Slaves, And in Case of Mortality
hereafter of my Son, without an Heir, my desire is that the Survivor
should Inherit the whole, and in Case of Mortality in both my
Sons, my desire is that Martha Gasey may Inherit my Son James
Estate, and that my Brother John Miller's Children may
Inherit my Son William's Estate, Equally to be Divided among
them.

Item. I do leave my Wife Margaret the Use of my Negroes James
and old Sarah, during her Natural Life, and after her Death
to be Equally divided between my two Sons James and William.
And my Will & Desire is that the Remainder of my Estate after
the just Debts & Legacies are paid, the Remainder to be Equally
divided between my Wife and my two Sons. And my Further
Desire is that my two Sons may be Bound to such Trades as
their Serious Moms to lead them to at the Age of Sixteen.
And I further do Constitute, Desire and Appoint my good
Friends George Willson and Edward Goodrich my whole & Sole
Executors to see my Will performed during the Minority of my
two Children. *In witness* whereof I have hereunto set
my Hand and affixed my Seal this 3^d day of July 1746.
