 followeth. *Imprimis* I give and Bequeath my Soul
 unto the Hands of Almighty God that gave it me, and to his
 Jesus Christ my Mediator and Redeemer in Hopes that
 I shall receive free Pardon and Forgiveness of all my Sins, and my
 Body I commit to the Earth from whence it was taken and
 there to be Buried at the Discretion of my Exec^r hereafter mentioned
 I *Item*. I give to my Grand Daughter Mary Page one Shilling.
 And all the rest of my Estate after my lawfull Debts & Funerall
 Charges Paid; I give to my Wife Ann Page during her Natural
 Life and after her Decease, I give it to Betty Fort to her & her
 Heirs Lawfully begotten of her own Body, and if she Dies without
 Heirs then to Joshua Fort, and to his Heirs forever. I do hereby
 make John Fort and Rebeckah Fort my whole Exec^r of this my
 last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 16th Day of October 1746.
