

- And as for my Worldly Goods I Bequeath
- 1st I give and Bequeath unto William Spright Son of John Spright at Fishing Creek, all my Land and Plantation during his Natural Life, and then to return at the Death of the said William to his Brother John Spright if he the said John is the Survivor, if not my Will and Desire is that my Land and Plantation shall fall to my Brother Nathaniel Son of Nathaniel Powell to him and his Heirs forever.
 - 2^d I give and Bequeath unto James Davis, one large Iron Pot and my Shoemakers Tools, and all my Coopers Tools.
 - 3^d I give unto Elizabeth Spright, Daughter John's Elizabeth Spright my best feather Bed and Furniture, and one pewter Basin, and three Plates, one Bell metal Skillet.
 - 4th I give unto William Spright that is above mentioned all my wearing Apparel and all the Cloth and Trimming that I have in my House that is unmade and one small Hand Gun.
 - 5th I give unto John Spright Son of John and Eliz. Spright before mentioned one large hand Gun.
- My Will and Desire is that after all my just Debts is paid, that all the Remainder part of my Estate that I have not already Disposed shall be equally Divided amongst the Persons hereafter mentioned, to wit, John Spright and William Spright Legates before mentioned and Ann Davis, Daughter of James Davis before mentioned. And I do appoint John Spright and William Spright my whole and Sole Exec^{rs} of this my last Will and Testament to perform it to the True Intent and meaning hereof. Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand Seal this 13th day of Septemb^r. 1747.
