In the name of God amen I Allen Chapman of Islipright being poorly but
of sound mind and memory thanks be given to God, do make and ordain this my
last will Testament in manner & form following, to wit, Item 1st I give &
bequeath unto Hardy Chapman one tract or parcel of land containing forty one
acres joining Mr. James Bridger and Susannah Price Thomas Hamak. to
him they heirs forever Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto Sally Chapman
one large blue painted chest, to her and her heirs forever - Item 3rd
I give and bequeath unto Harrison Chapman all my cloathing that I
now possess with to him they heirs forever - Item 4th I make & ordain
Hardy Chapman my whole and sole executor of this my last will Testament -
and I further disallow & disannul all other manner & form whatsoever - In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 1st day of February
