in decent christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubted but  
at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power

in this life, I give & devise & Dispose of the same in the following manner & form  
first I give and bequeath to my son John Coggins one cow & calf one steer and  
half my crop also I give and bequeath to my grandson Jonathan Coggins one  
bed and furniture one cow & calf one steer also I give and bequeath to my Daugh-  
ter Mary Jones my Negro wench Hannah & the other bed & cattle to be  
equally divided among my other children after paying my Debts, I Do here  
by utterly disallow, revoke & disannul all every other former testaments Wills  
legacies bequests & Executors by me in any wise before mentioned will & beque

qually divided among my other children after paying my debts, & do hereby  
by utterly disallow, revoke & disannul all every other former testaments, Wills  
legacies bequests & executors by me in any wise before mentioned, willed & bequea  
the & ratified & confirming this to be my last will & Testament in  
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twelfth Day of October  
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety Eight

counsel were & acknowledged their consent the penalty of three thousand  
dollars was by the Court granted them
