Last Will

I Charles Tynes free Negro Slave of the parish of Newport County of the
wight State of Virginia, do make my last will and Testament in man-
ner and form as followeth, to wit, first I give and bequeath unto my
beloved wife Peggy Tynes formerly Peggy Blair who was emancipated
by John Parker & ~~the~~ half of my Plantation where I now live whereon
my dwelling house stands and one half of my orchard one hundred
pounds in cash to be collected from Col. James Johnston exor. of
of Timothy Tynes dead on accounts of a legacy left me in said
Tynes Will and one half of my Stock of all kinds also one yoke of oxen
and my Horse and two bed & furniture to her then heirs forever, & I
give & bequeath unto David Tynes my Cousin, Son of my Sister
Nancy the other half of my Plantation adjoining William Blunts
land with the other half of my orchard & that it is my will and desire
that my uncle Charles Tynes Sen. shall build himself a house and
one half of David Tynes part, and that he the Charles Tynes Sen. shall
be the head of the family & David shall

live on it during their said lives to be used by them, & David when
he comes of age, To him this heirs forever - thirdly I give & bequeath
unto my said Uncle Charles Tynes Ten five pounds Cash & one
Cow to him & his heirs forever, fourthly I give & bequeath unto my
Uncle Sam Tynes ten pound Cash to him and his heirs forever, fifth
I give & bequeath unto my Sister Fanny Tynes ten pound Cash
to her & her heirs forever, Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my Sister
Nancy Tynes Ten pound Cash to her & her heirs forever - Seventhly
and Lastly it is my will & desire that the residue and balance of
my Estate of every kind & nature whatever except my house
& meat which I desire to be equally divided between my daugh-
ter Mary & David & that what will be David to keep the
said house & land & it is my wish & desire that my

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Cow to him & his heirs forever, fourthly I give & bequeath unto my
uncle Sam Tynes ten pound Cash to him and his heirs forever, fifth
I give & bequeath unto my Sister Fanny Tynes ten pound Cash
to her & her heirs forever, sixthly I give and bequeath unto my Sister
Nancy Tynes Ten pound Cash to her & her heirs forever - Seventhly
and Lastly it is my will & desire that the residue and balance of
my Estate of every kind & nature whatever except my house
& meadow which I desire to be equally divided between my said
children I desire that that which will be paid to help the
support of my said I desire and it is my will and desire that
my said children shall have the same I desire that the balance
of my said Estate shall be at the balance as before mentioned
I desire that the same shall be equally divided

between my Sister Jimmy & Sister Marys which was to them & their heirs forever,
and I do hereby ~~constitute~~ and appoint my friend Andrew Woodley my whole
and Sole executor to this my last will & Testament hereby revoking & disannul-
ling all former wills heretofore made by me. ~~Witness~~ ^{Witness} whereof I have
