Will

In the name of God Amen. I Elizabeth Young of the County of
Isle of Wight in Virginia being very weak & low in body, but in my perfect
senses and memory do think proper to make and ordain this to be my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following. I give &
bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Young the amount of money due me by
my son James Young, as will appear by a certain obligation given by the said
James to me for the payment of the sum of Twenty five Pounds annually, to her

said sum of money oblige mentioned should go to my son Thomas Michael Young and
his heirs. I give and bequeath unto my son Francis Young large black Wal-
nut Table & one black walnut Chest upon his paying my said Daughter
Anne fifty shilling to him & his heirs for ever. I give & bequeath unto
my son Bennett Young a looking glass to him and his heirs. I give
unto my son Francis Young five silver Tea spoons to him & his heirs. I do
hereby desire that all the rest & residue of my Estate of what nature
kind & ever be sold & after paying my Just debts & funeral expenses be

sum of money above mentioned should go to my son Thomas & Michael Young and
their heirs I give and bequeath unto my son Francis Young large black Wal-
nut Table & one black walnut Dish upon his paying my said Daughters
Anne fifty shilling to him & his heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath unto
my son Bennett Young plate & glass to him and his heirs. Item I also give
unto my son Francis Young five silver Tea spoons to him & his heirs. Item His
will & desire that all the rest & residue of my Estate or what nature of
Kind soever be sold & after paying my Just Debts funeral expenses due me

At a Court held for Isle of Wight County the 5th Day of February 1799.
 This Will was presented in Court by Bennett Young the Executor therein
 named who made oath thereto according to Law and the same being proved
 by the Oaths of William Bryant & Elizabeth Bryant two of the Witnesses
 thereto & Ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of the s^d Executor who
 together with George Baines his Security entered into & Acknowledged
 their bond in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars with Condition as
 as the said Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in
 due form.
