Thomas Purdie, which articles I bind my land for the payment
after my wife's death. - Then, I give, & bequeath unto my
wife all my household goods, and Kitchen furniture during her life
but should Mr Hodges be the longest lives it is my wish it should
go to her for her support, and at her death to pay my just
owed debts. -
