First I Undertully Desire the plantation where I now live; also two negroes by the name of Tom and Sam, bed and bedstead; also one horse and stock of Cattle and plantation ^{to} remain the same during her natural life; with all Dotts and profits arising therefrom; and after her death my will and Desire is that the said plantation and negroes and all other property remaining should be sold and equally divided amongst my Children by name James Duker, Bathel Duker, Sophia Duker, Sally Duker and Albert Duker; to them and their heirs forever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 2^d Day of November in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight hundred and Six
