and State of Virginia being sick and weak but of sound disposing mind and
memory, calling to mind the uncertainty of this mortal body do make
constitute and ordain this my Last will and testament First & principally
I dispose of my Estate in the following manner and form to wit, I term first,
I desire that all my lawfull debts and funeral charges be paid out of my
Estate, the residue and remainder of my estate I dispose of in the following
manner and form I term I give devise and bequeath unto my Son James
Brewer one Cow & calf that he has already received to him and his heirs
forever, I term I give devise and bequeath unto my Son Elijah Brewer one
Cow with calf to him and his heirs forever, I term I give devise and
bequeath to my Son William Brewer one Cow with calf to him & his heirs
forever, I term I give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Patsy Brewer
twenty dollars in cash to her and her heirs forever, I term I give devise and
bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Brewer all the residue and remainder
of my Estate also my Land and Plantations to Raise my small Children
upon as long as she lives and after my wife Mary Brewers death I
leave the same if any to my Son Michael Brewer, Nathan Brewer

of my Estate also my land and plantation to raise my small children
upon as long as she lives and after my wife Nancy Brewers death I
leave the same if any to my Son Michael Brewer, Nathan Brewer
Jury Brewer, Charles Brewer, & them & their heirs forever, I also app
oint Wm. L. Cookfins to be the executor to this my last will and
intestment in writing when I shall have made it my hand & seal to this present
the 1st day of July in the year 1818.

1799 The a bond held for John Wightman the 5th day of September 1803 This
 Will was presented into Court by William Lankford the executor therein named
 whomade oath thereto according to Law and the same being perused by the
 Court of John Bond and Benjamin Bradshaw two of the judges thereof
 and ordered to be recorded - and on the motion of said executor who together
 with Benjamin Bradshaw his security entered into and acknowledged
 their Bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars with condition as that Law
 directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probat thereof in due form
 of Law
