mind and Memory thanks be to the Almighty for the service I do make and ordain
this to be my Last will and Testament in manner and form as follows. I Leave
the use of one half of the Land and plantation that I now live on that is all the
Land that I bought of Andrew Griffiths and James Hunter that is the Land that
I includes the plantation I say one half of it with my Dwelling houses and one
half of my Apple Orchard and one half of my byder Still to my Loving wife Chris-
tina Duck her life and after her Death I give the same with the Remains
of the Land above mentioned to my son Joseph Duck to him and his heirs
for ever that the other half of this Land that I have left to my wife I give
it to my son Joseph Duck. I then give and Bequeath to my son Joseph Duck
one Negro man named Sam One felle saddle and Bridle five head of cattle
three head of sheep one feather Bed and furniture one pine chest one Gun and one
half of my Apple Orchard and one half of my byder Still Six paper plates
two Dishes and two Basins and one half of cider Casks and fifty pounds Cash
I then give and Bequeath to my Daughter Orinda Duck all the Land that
I bought of Lot Griffiths and James Hunter to her and her heirs for ever also one
Negro girl named Sel one feather Bed and furniture one pine chest six put in

two Dishes and two Basins and one half of Cider Casks and fifty pounds Cash
Then Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Perla Dick all the Land that
I Bought of Lott Griffiths and Jamieson Butler to her and her heirs for ever also one
Negro Girl named Solo one feather Bed and furniture and five Chests put in
plates one Dish one Basin three head of cattle a thirty pounds Cash Then Give
and Bequeath to my Daughter Melisont Dick all the Land that I Bought of
Joshua Daugherty to her and her heirs for ever also One Negro man named
Vance also one feather Bed and furniture and fifty pounds Cash Then Give and
Bequeath to my son Jacob Holland Dick all the Land that I Bought of the
Bakers and Thomas ^{Isle of Wight Co. Wills 1794-1805} ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} to him and his heirs or assigns for ever also one
hundred and fifty Pounds Cash Then I Leave the use of one Negro man named
Ben and my Smiths tool to my wife her Heirs for & hers and what may
come from Holland Dick and after her Death or marriage give the use
of one Negro and the Smiths tool to my son Jacob Holland Dick and his heirs
for & hers the use of the rest and Remainder of all my Lands then I Give
and Give from both Tool and personal to my young wife Eliza and David
her Heirs or assigns which she and she Heirs or assigns shall have all part
of the same that they get her the use of & hers and & assigns of it

These I do not deny I gave with a good conscience to all my
 children Joseph Duck, Thos. Duck, William Duck and John Richard Duck
 and then here lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my loving wife and my
 son Joseph Duck my heirs and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament
 Revoking and making Void all other wills heretofore made By me In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Tenth Day of December
 1796
