Ordain this my last will and Testament in manner & form following VIZ —

Item 1st I Give & bequeath unto my son James Stallings & to his heirs forever the
Land and plantation that I purchased of J. Boulton & Philip Moody, I do

Give to said son James Stallings & to his heirs forever One Negro Woman Lucy &
all her future increase, One Horse, saddle & bridle to the amount of Thirty Pounds
and two Cows & calves, & one Feather bed Furniture and thirty pounds Cash. —

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Item 2^d I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sally Stallings & to her heirs
forever One Negro Woman Sarah, and all her future increase two Cows & calves,
One Feather bed Furniture One dark bay colt, saddle & bridle, and Sixty Pounds
Cash; Item 3rd I Give & bequeath unto my son Josiah Stallings, to him and his

Heirs forever One Negro boy Jacob and one Negro man Sam after my mothers
decease. — Item 4th I Give & bequeath unto my son Solomon Stallings to him and
his heirs forever, One Negro boy Ellick. — Item 5th I Give and bequeath unto my

son William Stallings to him and his heirs forever, One Negro boy Ellick. —

Son William Stallings to him and his Heirs forever, Overseer Girl Rose, and
all her future increase, & Thirty pounds Cash. - Item 6th I gave and bequeath
unto my Loving Wife Lucy Stallings during her natural life Overseer man
Hall & One bay Horse, that common runs in the chain & the chain & two Beds
& Furniture, and two cows & four Heifers, & two potts, and potsacks, and two Sows
& pigs and one third of the corn fodder meat, & One falling table, and looking
Glas. & One Desk, and one third of the plantation whereon Sarah live, Also Six
likely Ewes. - Item 7th I give and bequeath unto my Three Children namely Sarah
Stallings, Solomon Stallings & William Stallings the residue of my estate to be
sold & equally divided. - Item 8th I do hereby nominate & appoint James Gwaltney my
Executor to this my last will & Testament and if he will not serve I nominate
and appoint Joseph Springfield my Executor. & It is my desire that Mr James
Gwaltney may accept of the bequest and be well paid out of my Estate. In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 29th day of
Sept^r in the second Eight Hundred & one.

At a Court held for Stafford County December the 7th 1801 this Will was
 Presented in Court by James Gwaltney the Executor therein named who made oath
 thereto according to Law and the same being proved by the oaths of William Gay Thomas
 Pitman and attorney before three of the Writings Sheriffs and ordered to be recorded
 On the motion of said Executor who together with John Gwaltney & Joseph H. Stimpf
 his securities entered into and Acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Ten
 Thousand Dollars with Condition as the law directs certificate is granted them for
 obtaining probat thereof in due form.
