Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. I bequeath my

my estate to be equally divided between my daughters Polly and Harriett. but in case
my wife should be deceased of ability in some months after my decease it is my Will
and desire that each Child shall have a proportionable part of my estate equally with my

December 1798. This Will was presented in Court by William Thomson the executor
above named who made oath thereunto according to law and the same being read
and the same being found to be the last Will and Testament of the said Lewis Jordan

of the said Court do hereby certify. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and the seal of the said Court this 11th day of December 1798.
