and his heirs forever — 4th I give to my son Joshua Daughtrey five Shillings
to him and his heirs forever — 5th I give to my Daughter Sally Butler five
Shillings to her and her heirs forever — 6th I give to my Daughter Char-
lotte Daughtrey & Joshua Daughtrey the remainder of my estate to be equally
divided between them, namely, Charlotte & Joshua Daughtrey —
Lastly I nominate and appoint my friend Jacob Johnson Executor to this my last
will Testament as Witness my hand and Seal this 6th day of August one thou-
