I Richard Daughtrey of Islipwight County being weakly
 in body but of sound mind and memory thank be to god
 for the same, I do hereby make and ordain this to be my
 last will and Testament, In manner and form as follows
 Vizt I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter ~~Elizabeth~~
 Daughtrey half the use of one Negro fellow Ned, her life and
 at her death to her Son John Council Daughtrey also two
 Negro Women Named Phillis & Grace and all Graces increase
 also one feather bed and furniture, one Cow and calf and one
 third part of Sider Still and half of my side Saddle to her
 and her heirs forever, Item I lend unto my Daughter Paddy
 Holland half the use of one Negro fellow Ned her life and at her
 death to said John Council Daughtrey, also thirty Acres of
 Land wherein the said John Council Daughtrey is now living

Land whereon she now lives, her life and at her death to my
Son Hardy Daughters Children to be equally divided between
them all I have I send unto my Son Hardy Daughter the
Land & Plantations he now lives on except thirty acres that
I have before lent to my Daughter Patty Holland, also two
Negroes Mingo the eldest and Dave and after his death I give the
same to his Children, named as follows, Patty, Treary, Savannah,
James and Edwin to be equally divided between them & their
heirs forever, I have I send unto my Daughter Honour Daughter
one Negro Woman named Fido and all her Increase on feath-
er & Furniture one bow and half one third part of my bygon
Saddle one half of my side Saddle, her life and at her death to
be equally divided between her two Children, they are Mary & then

Land & Plantations he now lives an exempt thirty Acres that
I have before lent to my Daughter Patty Holland, also two
Negroes Mingo the eldest and Dave and after his death I give the
same to his Children, named as follows, Patty, Freney, Susannah,
James and Edwin to be equally divided between them & their
Heirs forever, I then I lend unto my Daughter Honora Daughtrey
one Negro Woman named Fid and all her Increase on feather
ed Furniture one bow and ball one third part of my Byrd
shot one half of my Side Saddle her life and at her death to
be equally divided between her two Children Bay and Mary to them
and their Heirs forever, I then I give and bequeath unto my son
John and his daughter all the Land and Plantations and one Negro
boy named George the younger, one cow and one sheep

part of my byer State to him and his heirs forever, I then I give and
bequeath unto my Grandson John Council Daughtrey all the
land that I bought of David Ely and Binja Baker one man.

Polly and one Negro Boy named Andrew to him & his heirs forever,

I then I give and bequeath unto my five Children Elizabeth, Patty,
Mary, Honor, and Richard also my Grandson John Council

Daughtrey all the remainder part of my estate both real and

personal to be equally divided between them, and their heirs for

ever, Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Godwin Council

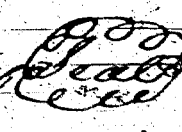
my sole & sole executor of this my last Will & Testament Revoking

all other wills heretofore made by me in Witness whereof I have

hereunto Set my hand & Seal September 14th day 1803 —

At a Court held for Isle of Wight County the 2^d day of April 1804 This Will
was presented into Court by Godwin Buncell the executor therein named
who made oath thereto according to Law, and the same being proved by
the oaths of Theophilus Daughtrey Abraham Daughtrey and Solomon
Daughtrey the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded - And on the
motion of said executor who together with Joseph Duck and John Clay
his Sureties interpleaded and acknowledged their bond in the penalty
of five Thousand Dollars with conditions as the Law directs. Certificate
is given him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form of Law.
