be to god almighty god for the same & in the year of our Lord Christ one thou-
sand seven hundred and Ninety seven considering that all men must die,
do give and bequeath soul unto almighty god hoping for expectation in
Jesus Christ my saviour & for what worldly estate it hath pleased the
Almighty to bless me with After paying my just debts & Funeral ex-
pences I dispose of in the following manner Viz. I Give unto my
beloved Wife Patience Holland two Bedsteads with names upon them and London
one bedstead named after the first choice of two feather Beds with fu-
rmore one made by the name of ~~the~~ over one side saddle & bridle four
head of cattle first choice during her life & after her Deceased so. My
man Saml & Deborah named after his increase if any at her decease to be equal
divided between my five children To wit **Rolland James Holland** John
James Henry Thomas & William To have each one sixth part and these I have given
unto them as I have written my Son Robert Holland To have the sum of £100
to him in full of his debt of £100 which he owes me at the time of my death
I have also given unto my daughter Mary the sum of £50 to her in full of her
debt of £50 which she owes me at the time of my death

And the above Negroes lent to my son Everett Holland to be equally divided betwixt Charles Holland Everett Holland and Nancy Holland unto them & their heirs for ever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son James Holland one Negro woman named Venus & one Negro boy named Scotland unto him and his heirs for ever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my grandson Robert Marshall one Negro boy named Jordan provided he arrives to the age of twenty one years of age & has a lawful heir if not for the said Negro Jordan to be equally divided betwixt my children Everett Holland, James Holland, Sally Davice, Betsey Randolph & Mitty Holland ^{Isle of Wight Co. Wills 1794-1868} ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} unto them & their heirs for ever.

Item. I lend unto my Daughter Sally Davice one Negro woman named Bago & one Negro girl Olive during her ^{natural} life and after her decease, to be equally divided between all her children unto them and their heirs for ever. Item. I lend unto my Daughter Betsey Randolph one Negro man named Briston and one Negro girl named Mary, during her life & after her decease if she has any children or child for the said Negroes to be equally divided between them if no child or children then for the said Negro Briston & Mary with her increase if any to be equally divided between my children Everett Holland

11 that the same be unto them and their heirs

James Holland Sally Davie & Milly Hancock unto them and their heirs
for ever. Item. I lend unto my Daughter Milly Hancock, one Negro Woman,
named Cleary, & one Negro Girl Tacey during her natural life, & after her
decease for the said Negroes to be equally divided her children unto them and
their heirs for ever. Item. All the remainder part of what soever kind, or
quality of my Estate to be sold and after paying my just Debts and funeral
expences to be equally divided between my children to Wit. Everett Holland.
James Holland Sally Davie Betsey Randolph & Milly Hancock unto them
and their heirs for ever. Item. I do hereby appoint & nominate my Son James
Holland my whole and sole executor of this my last Will and Testament.
I do anelling and revoking all other Wills or Wills heretofore by me made in
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affix at my Seal this fifth

Day of February 1797. —

together with William Hancock, and Joseph Pope, his securities entered into
and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of twenty Shores and pounds
with conditions as the Law directed ~~certificates~~ granted him for ob-
taining a probate of said form.
