I give & bequeath to my Son Josiah Underwood, a feather bed & furniture, one chest & my large gun & my still cap & woom, to him & his heirs forever, All the ^{rest} ~~right~~ of my Estate as I have not yet given, & stock after funeral charges ^{not} ~~paid~~ ^{of} my Executors paid I leave it be equally divided between my Son John Underwood & my Son Josiah Underwood & my Daughter Mary Underwood, & my Daughter Anne Underwood, to them & their heirs forever. And Lastly I do appoint my Son Josiah Underwood my whole Executor of this my last Will & Testament to see all my whole business finished as Witnesse & my hand and seal this 2^d 8th day of August one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven.
