Know all men by these presents that I Francis Boykin Senior of the County of Isle of Wight and State of Virginia, do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner and following, that is to say. 1st I give to my Daughter Nancy Boykin three Negroes to wit, Taymor, Lou Lee, and Taymor's Daughter Charlotte and Peggy daughter to her and her heirs forever, 2nd I give to my son John Boykin Ten dollars to him this time ~~for~~, 3rd I give to my son Francis M. Boykin the Courthouse plantation whereon I now live to him this heirs forever, 4th I also give to my daughter Nancy Boykin my burywack plantation, formerly bank ford to her and her heirs forever. 5th I also give ^{an} to my said son Francis M. Boykin and my daughter Nancy Boykin, all my right, title, interest and demand to my land lying on the head waters of Licking, in the state of Kentucky to them their heirs forever, 6th It is my will and desire that as soon as Benjamin Hingfield shall pay the balance of the money that he is owing for the plantation whereon he now lives, that my executors shall give him a Deed for the same to him and his heirs ~~for~~ ^{for} all the rest of my estate both real and personal of what nature or kind soever

ing for the plantation whereon he now lives, that my executors shall give
him a Deed for the same to him and his heirs ~~for~~ ^{with} all the rest of
my estate both real & personal, of what nature or kind soever
it may be not herein before particularly disposed of. I Give to be
Equally divided between my said Son Francis M. Boykin, and my
said Daughter Nancy Boykin to them & their heirs for ever.

8th and lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my said Son Francis
M. Boykin and Andrew Woodley executors of this my last will and
Testament hereby disannulling and revoking all other wills
heretofore made by me, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & affixed my seal this 2nd day of March 1810 at the
City of New York.

of April 1805 This Will was presented in Court by Francis M. Boydin one of the
executors therein named who made oath thereto according to Law, and
the same being proved by the oaths of William Chapman Samuel
Bracy two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded — on the
motion of the said executor who together with Dolphin Driver and
Emanuel Wills his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in
the penalty of Twenty thousand Dollars with condition as the law directs
certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form of
Law —
