this to be my last Will and Testament in Manner and form
following. First I give and bequeath my Soul to God that first
gave it me, hoping for mercy and Redemption. Having body to the
earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors
I give and bequeath the same to my wife Mary Dixon to have and to
dispose of the same as she shall think fit.

I Now Live on during her life. Likewise One Cow and calf. One sow
and Pigs one Feather Bed and Furniture and the Use of my Negro Wo-
man Anny. Also One Iron Pott and frying pan one Tub, Pigen and
Pail, One Spining Wheel and Cards, four Chairs, One Oreal Table One
Pewter Dish, two basons and six plates, One Work beast, During her
Life and after her Decease. I Give and Bequeath as followen Item I
Give and bequeath to my son William Diacon Half the Plantation
I Now Live On likewise Half the Plantation I Bought of Charles Wal-
ter. Also One Negro Boy ^{Ile of Wight Co. Wills 1794, 1803} ~~named~~ ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} Anny, One Cow and calf, One
Yoke of Steers, One Sow and Pigs to him and his Heirs for Ever.

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my son Murphrey Diacon the other half
of each of the said Plantations, One Negro Boy named Lazarus, One
Work Steer, One Sow and Pigs, One Gun, One Bed and Furniture to
him and His Heirs for ever. The Lands to be Divided equally as my
Two Sons William and Murphrey can agree. Item. I Give and
Bequeath all the Rest of my Estate, After my just Debts and funeral
charges are paid to be equally Divided Among my four Daughters.

Viz. Betsey Penelope, Mary and Martha And I do hereby appoint
and Ordain my Son William Dixon to be my whole and sole Executor
of this my last Will and Testament. As Witness my hand and seal
