

In the name of God amen I Jacob Vellines of the County
of Felsell Wight being well in body and of sound mind and memory do make
this for my last Will and Testament in manner and form following and do consti-
tute the same. First I lend unto my loving wife Mary Vellines the whole of
the plantation I now live on also four negroes Darius Joan, Dinah, and Phill, all
my household and Kitchen furniture all my house stock of cattle & hogs during
her natural life and after her decease my Will and desire is that my Estate
shall be divided as follows. I give and bequeath unto my
son Amstead Vellines and his heirs forever either Hannah, and Simon, I
give and bequeath unto my son John Vellines and his heirs for ever
from negroes Aggy, Moses, Daniel, and Sam. I lend unto my wife
Mary after the Decease of my wife one Negroe Waman Joan
during her natural life and after her decease I give her and her in-
crease to be equally divided between my surviving children and their
heirs for ever. I give unto my son Isaac Vellines after the Decease
of my wife to him his heirs for ever Dinah, Phill and Aaron & I give
and the hole of my land that I do now possess and the fruit of my Estate

shall be divided as followeth Viz: — I Give and bequeath unto my
son Amistead Vellins and his Heirs forever Either Hamnah, and Simon, I Give
and Bequeath unto my son John Vellins and his Heirs for ever
from Negroes Aggy Moses Daniel and Sam I Give and bequeath unto my
Sons only after the Decease of my Wife one Negroe Woman Joan
During her natural life and after her decease I Give her and her
issue to Be equally Divided Between my surviving Children and their
Heirs for ever I Give unto my son Isaac Vellins after the Decease
of my Wife to him and his Heirs forever the Plantation of Pines
and the hole of my land that I do now possess and the Plantation of my land
that I have not heretofore Given away I do here by Consensus and ap-
point my son Isaac Vellins my Executor to this my Last Will and
Testament Given under my hand and Seal this 10th Day of the 17th of
Witness.

Isle of Wight Co. Wills 1794-1803
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 At about half for Island of Wight County the 4th Day of June 1798,
 This will was presented in Court by Isaac Vellins the Executor therein named
 who made oath thereto according to law, and the same being proved by the
 oaths of Edmund Corley and John Lykes two of the Witnesses thereto and
 ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of the said Executor who together
 with William Blunt his security entered into and acknowledged their bond
 in the penalty of ten thousand Dollars, with condition as the law directs,
 Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form.
