Fifthly I desire that my Executor privately sell my interest of $138\frac{1}{4}$ acres of land bequeathed to me by my Uncle Hugh Bragg, lying in the County of James City Virginia and place the proceeds thereof at interest the said interest to be paid to my wife Emeline Turner during her natural life and after her death, I desire that the principal sum be equally divided between my aforesaid son Wm. Turner and my grand daughter Sarah Turner the child of my son Joseph Turner.

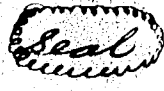
