


The last Will and Testament of Charles M Hubbard?

- First. I hereby revoke all Wills or other writings in the nature of a Will heretofore made by me.
- Second. I desire that all my just debts be paid as soon as practicable after my death and designate all Claims and debts due me as the source from which such debts are to be paid, if sufficient for that purpose.
- Third. I give my son Wilson, my horse Belday, Thurnip, the horse being that purchased of my son Deland and all the debts due me & all money arising from such debts, subject to the payment of my debts as above provided, and desire that he will apply the same to the completion of his education, I give him further my Medical Books, Instruments & Medicines, with Cases in which they are kept,
- Fourth. I give to my wife Mary Ann all the rest and residue of my property of every kind and description: I hereby appoint my son J D Hubbard Executor of this my last Will & Testament all of which has been wholly written by me - I interlineations & erasures made by me before signing.
- In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand affix my Seal this 26th day Feby: 1875.


