Your Commissioner in pursuance of an order of the County Court made on the 9th day of July last (a copy of which order is herewith returned) having posted said order at the front door of the Courthouse of this County on two Court days consecutively, and also a notice fixing upon the 17th day of August 1866 as the time and the Clerk's Office of this County as the place for taking the evidence upon which this account is based, proceeded at the time and place appointed to ascertain in what sum of money is necessary for the annual support of Frances P. Daylor, whether the sum should be levied of the principal or interest due her or of both, and to apportion the amount ascertained upon the debtors ratably.

Upon the evidence before your Commissioner the sum of three hundred dollars per annum is considered necessary for her support which sum appears quite moderate when it includes Board Washing light medical bill and such additions to her wardrobe as may be absolutely necessary.

It seems to Your Commissioner that an account of the large amount of interest in arrear the sum to be raised should be levied upon the interest. Your Commissioner has estimated the interest upon each debt up to the 1st day of July 1866, and has ascertained the amount of interest upon each debt upon that day ratably -

Your Commissioner has found it necessary to make up two statements "A" & "B" and for the following reason

It is ^{the} plain an evident intention of the act of Assembly to require every debtor to the party or parties proceeding under a petition of this nature to pay his ratable share at the amt to be raised, in order that the burthen may fall as lightly as possible upon each, but it is equally clear that the amount necessary for the annual support of the subject must be raised and if some of the debtors are insolvent or from other cause, their ratable share cannot be collected the whole burthen must be borne by those who are capable of paying - It appears to your Commissioner that the Bond in Statement "A" numbered 21 the interest upon which on the 1st day of July 1866 is \$96.54 is executed by Willis Mathews who is dead, that he has no perishable property upon which an execution could be levied, it is likely the per. rep. might decline to pay the amount ascertained on him, in which case the only remedy would be a suit in Chancery which Your Commissioner is satisfied is not contemplated by the Law under which he is acting, as such a result would entirely defeat its object.

Your Commissioner has deemed it best, however, to ascertain the amount with which the per. rep. of Willis Mathews should be ascertained and advise that he be required to pay by such proceeding as the statute provides, as the same if paid would reduce the amount to be paid by the remaining debtors, but in the event that the same should not be realized, the Statement "A" will show additional amount will fall to the lot of the other debtors to pay.
