Viz. An Account due Henry J Enos for thirty months board at six dollars per month making One hundred and Eighty dollars, and account paid by Henry J Enos to Dr. Snow for medical services amounting to Ten Dollars and account due Miss Piggott, for schooling amounting to Three Dollars and twenty five Cents amounting in total to Two hundred & thirty Dollars and twenty five Cents.
