affix my Signature and Seal this 22nd day of April 1882.

Monday the 9th day of October 1882.

A writing purporting to be the last will and Testament of Judith
Hunsley deceased, bearing date on the 22nd day of April 1882. was this
day presented to Court. and upon the evidence of George Nelson and Isaiah
Ashlock. and Geo E Richardson the latter as to the hand writing of William
who wrote the will, the former two, subscribing witnesses thereto who made
 oath, That Judith Hunsley acknowledged and subscribed the same as her free

as her last will and testament, and they the said George Nelson and Isaac Ashlock, at the request of the testatrix, and in her presence subscribed the subscribed the same as witnesses, which said last will and testament being fully proven to the satisfaction of the court. It is ordered that said writing be recorded as and for the last will and Testament of Judith Hundley deceased.

And upon the motion of William Williams the Executor named in the will, he is permitted to qualify as Executor, whereupon he appeared in Court and took the usual Oaths prescribed by law. and together with George Nelson and Isaac Ashlock his securities - Entered into a Bond in the penalty of One hundred Dollars. It is ordered that letters of administration be made out in due form of law for William Williams as Executor of Judith Hundley deceased.
