Fourth. I hereby constitute and appoint J. F. Hubbard executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others at any time previously made by me, Witness my hand and seal the day and year first above written

Hubbard, the Executor therein named, he is permitted to qualify as Executor of Thomas Wynne deceased, whereupon he appeared in Court and took the usual Oaths prescribed by law and with John W. Hubbard his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of seven hundred and fifty dollars
