

In the name of God Amen. I William Debrif of the County of New Kent State of Virginia, do make this my last will and Testament, revoking all others made by me at any previous time. as follows: My desire is to be buried with as little expense as decency will permit, and that my debt and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as conveniently may be, And I give my house and lot Situate, lying and being in the City of Williamsburg with its appurtenances unto my Grand Daughter and Son, Sally and Charles Debrif, to be equally divided between them, In the event the said Sally Debrif depart this life without issue then her brother Charles Debrif shall have the whole of the said house and lot, but should the said Charles Debrif depart this life without issue, then the said Sally Debrif shall have and hold all of the said house and lot. And I give unto my two Sons Henry and William H Debrif One Dollar each to be paid out of my personal property.

In witness whereof I the said testator William Debrif have hereto set my hand and seal on the 18th day of February 1874.

At a Court held for James City County, and the City of Williamsburg at the Court house thereof in said City on Monday the 12th day of October 1874.

A writing bearing date on the 18th day of February 1874 purporting to be the last will and testament of William Debrif deceased.

was this day produced in Court, and upon the testimony of Henry B. Warren and Robert Greenhow, two subscribing witnesses thereto, who made oath that William Debrif deceased acknowledged and subscribed the same as his last will and testament in their presence, they all being present at the same time, and they the said Henry B. Warren and Robert Greenhow, at the request of said testator and in his presence and in the presence of each other subscribed the same as witnesses, which said last will and testament being fully proven to the satisfaction of the Court. It is ordered that said writing bearing date the 18th day of February 1874 be recorded as and for the last true will and testament of William Debrif deceased.

And on the motion of Henry B. Warren, he is permitted to qualify as administrator upon the Estate of William Debrif deceased. Whereupon he appeared in Court and took the Oaths prescribed by law, and together with Wm E Morcock as his Security (who justified as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One hundred Dollars Conditioned as the law directs, and it is ordered that letters of Administration be made out in due form of law for Henry B. Warren as Administrator of William Debrif deceased.
