To be held and enjoyed by her in absolute property, for her own sole use and benefit forever. I appoint my said wife my Executrix and desire that no Security may be required of her.

Given under my hand and Seal this 18th day of September 1860.

At a Court held for the County of James City at the Courthouse there of in the City of Williamsburg on Monday the 14th day of December 1860.

A Writing purporting to be the last Will & Testament of William Wilborn Sec^d bearing date on the 18th day of September 1860. Was this day presented in Court and proven by the Oaths of Lemuel G. Bowden one of the Subscribing Witnesses thereto, who made Oath that William Wilborn deceased, acknowledged and subscribed the same as his last Will and testament in his presence and in the presence of Lemuel J. Bowden Sec^d another Subscribing Witness thereto (two Competant Witnesses) they both being present at the ^{same} time, and they the said Lemuel G. Bowden and Lemuel J. Bowden at the request of the said Testator and in his presence and in the presence of each other, subscribed the same as Witnesses which said Writing being duly proven to the satisfaction of the Court as the last Will & Testament of said William Wilborn Sec^d therefore it is Ordered that said Writing bearing date on the 18th day of September 1860 be recorded as and for the last Will & Testament of the said William Wilborn Sec^d.
