I Andrew Broach of the County of King and Queen and  
State of Virginia, do make and ordain this my last will and  
testament in manner and form following:

Firstly I recommend my body to the ground to be buried in  
a Christian manner at the discretion of my friends and my soul  
to the protection of Almighty God, who gave it.

Secondly I give to my beloved wife, after paying all my just  
debts, all the property I may be possessed of Booth's real and  
personal during her natural life or widowhood.

Thirdly I give to my son George W Broach the piece of land  
and I purchased of Minor's tract containing Thirty five acres  
more or less and being the same on which the said George W Broach  
now lives and at his death to be equally divided between his lawful  
children.

Fourthly I give to my daughter Emily Broach the tract of land  
on which I now live being the same formerly owned by Benson  
Broach, and a good bed and furniture, a half dozen chairs  
half dozen knives and forks, a Cupboard, a good milk Cow: But in  
case she should die without a living and lawfull heir, then it shall  
belong to George W Broach's children surviving.

Fifthly I give to my daughters Polly Broach and Susan Broach  
the sum of One Shilling each as their portion of my Estate.

Sixthly I leave my son George W Broach my sole Executor
