I Andrew Broach of the County of King and Queen and State of Virginia, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following.

First of all I recommend my body to the Ground to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my friends and my Soul to the protection of Almighty God, who gave it.

Secondly I give to my beloved wife, after paying all my just debts, all the property I may be possessed of Both real and personal during her natural life or widowhood.

Thirdly I give to my son George W Broach the piece or parcel of Land I purchased of Minors tract containing thirty five acres more or less and being the same on which the said George W Broach now lives and at his death to be equally divided between his lawful Children.

Fourthly I give to my daughter Emily Broach the tract of land on which I now live being the same formerly owned by Benoni Broach, and a good bed and furniture, a half dozen chairs half dozen knives and forks, a Cupboard, a good milch Cow: But in case she should die without a living and lawful heir, then it shall ~~the same~~ go to George W Broach's Children surviving.

Fifthly I give to my daughters Polly Broach and Susan Broach the sum of One Shilling each as their portion of my Estate.

Sixthly. I leave my son George W Broach my sole Executor.
