In the name of God, Amen! I Sarah A. Deshazo, of King
& Queen Co. Ky. hereby revoking all former wills, do make
this my last will and testament. I direct that all my
just debts be paid; and subject thereto, I give and
bequeath all the estate of every description, of which,
I may die possessed, to Charles R. Krum in trust for
my grand children Minnie Lee and Nellie M. Krum,
to be held by him as their joint property subject however,
to the following limitations: Should either of my said
grand children, die under twenty one years of age
without issue, the survivor shall be entitled to the
whole; And if both of them should die, under twenty
one years of age, and without issue, then at the death
of the survivor of them; I give one half of my said estate
to the Southern Baptist Convention, formed in Augusta
Georgia in the month of May 1845 and chartered by
the Legislature of the State of Georgia by an act,
passed and approved December 29th 1845, for
foreign missions; and the other one half, I give
and bequeath to William J. Haynes with the request
that he will apply the same, in such way, as he
may deem best, for the benefit of Bonington Church.
This bequest to him however is absolute and un-
conditional notwithstanding said request. It
is my intention that the income of my estate,
shall be applied towards the education and
maintenance of my grand children, during their
