This last will and testament of B. F. Bland did  
as produced in Court by Bedford A Vaughan the  
Executor herein named and there being no subscriber  
witness Thos. John H Vaughan & John R J Vaughan  
were sworn and severally deposed that they are  
acquainted with the testator's handwriting and  
very believe the said writing and the name Thos.  
subscribed to be wholly written by the testator  
own hand. Whereupon the said writing is ordered  
to be recorded as the true last will and testament  
of the said B. F. Bland did. And on the motion  
of the said Bedford A. Vaughan the Executor  
herein named who made oath Thos. and  
together with John R J Vaughan his surety  
(who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) Ent  
into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty

In the name of God, Amen! I Sarah A. Dishago, of King  
& Queen Cottages, hereby revoking all former wills, do make  
this my last will and testament. I direct that all my  
just debts be paid; and subject thereto, I give and  
bequeath all the estate of every description, of which,  
I may die possessed, to Charles R. Nunn in trust for  
my grand children Minnie Lee and Willie McConnell,  
to be held by him as their joint property subject however,  
to the following limitations: Shared either of my said  
grand children, die under twenty one years of age  
without issue, the survivor shall be entitled to the  
whole; And if both of them should die, under twenty  
one years of age, and without issue, then at the death  
of the survivor of them; I give one half of my said estate  
to the Southern Baptist Convention, formed in Augusta  
Georgia in the month of May 1845 and chartered by  
the Legislature of the state of Georgia by an act  
passed and approved December 29<sup>th</sup> 1845, for  
foreign missions; And the other one half, I give  
and bequeath to William J. Hayes with the request  
that he will apply the same, in such way, as he  
may deem best, for the benefit of Bevington Church.  
This bequest to him however is absolute and un-  
& Conditional notwithstanding said request. It  
is my intention that the income of my Estate,  
shall be applied towards the education and  
maintenance of my grand children, during their
