

In the name of God, amen; I Jane Caroline Henley
 of Henric & Queen Co. Va. do make this my last will
 and testament as follows. To wit: I hereby give and
 bequeath to my father Rev. J. Henley all the
 estate of which I may be possessed during
 his lifetime and at his death, I give the
 same to my half sister Louisa F. Henley and
 the Children of my deceased Brother Thomas
 M. Henley, to be equally distributed among them
 with the following limitations, I hereby either
 of my deceased Brother Children alive under
 twenty one years of age or without issue.
 I think that the share of any said children
 so dying, shall go to the survivors of them
 until if it should so happen, there being
 one of them left, who in that case shall
 take the whole and if all of them die
 under twenty one or without issue, then I
 think that the same shall go to my half
 Brother Rev. J. Henley and half sister
 Louisa F. Henley to be equally divided
 among them & I further entitling and
 empowering my father by last will and
 testament to appoint a Trustee for said
 Children of my deceased Brother Thomas M.
 Henley, who may be under twenty one years
 of age. I appoint my said father Rev. J.
 Henley my executor and I think that he
 be not required to give any security as such.

 of October 1883.
