I Cary Kemp of the County of King and Queen State of Virginia being of
sound and disposing mind, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
revoking all other wills heretofore made.

I desire first that all my just debts shall be paid. I desire that after
the payment of all my just debts I give all my property during life to
my wife Christiana Kemp & Sept my bay colt which I give to my
son Jas H Kemp & my grey mare which I give to my son Leary
Straughan Kemp. If my wife desires to sell any of the personal
property belonging to my estate I grant her the privilege of so doing.

After the death of my wife I desire that all my property
shall be equally divided among my children then living. If
any of them should have died leaving issue, then their children
shall receive the share which would have fallen to them had they
then have been living. I appoint my wife Christiana Kemp
my executrix & require that she shall not require her to give
security for her administration upon my estate. Given under
